# **Advantages of Presumptions**

- Simplify adjudications Eliminate need to gather evidence and decide complex issues
- Fill evidentiary gaps Infeasible or burdensome to obtain direct evidence on an issue
- Promote accurate and consistent decisions
- No burden of proof service incurrence or aggravation

# Chronic Diseases – 38 CFR 3.309(a)

# Diseases Specific to Former Prisoners of War – 38 CFR 3.309(c)

If the former POW was detained for 30 or more days, the following diseases shall be service connected:

- Avitaminosis
- Beriberi (including beriberi heart disease)
- Chronic dysentery
- Helminthiasis
- Malnutrition (including optic atrophy associated with malnutrition)
- Pellagra
- Any other nutritional deficiency
- Irritable bowel syndrome
- Peptic ulcer disease
- Peripheral neuropathy except where directly related to infectious causes
- Cirrhosis of the liver

The following diseases shall be service connected, regardless of the time the former POW was detained:

- Psychosis
- Any of the anxiety states
- Dysthymic disorder (or depressive neurosis)
- Organic residuals of frostbite, if it is determined that the veteran was interned in climatic conditions consistent with the occurrence of frostbite
- Post-traumatic osteoarthritis
- Stroke and its complications
- Atherosclerotic heart disease or hypertensive vascular disease

# Presumption of Service Connection for Former POWs with Cirrhosis of the Liver

**Impact Estimate** 

- Administrative costs: \$45,820 in 2001 and \$624,106 through 2006
- FTE: No additional FTE would be needed
- No significant increase in claims

# Diseases Specific to Radiation-Exposed Veterans – 38 CFR 3.309(d)

- Leukemia (other than chronic lymphocytic leukemia)
- Thyroid cancer
- Breast cancer
- Pharynx cancer
- Esophageal cancer
- Stomach cancer
- Cancer of the small intestine
- Pancreatic cancer
- Multiple myeloma
- Lymphomas (except Hodgkin's disease)
- Cancer of the bile ducts
- Cancer of the gall bladder
- Primary liver cancer (except cirrhosis or hepatitis B is indicated)

- · Cancer of the salivary gland
- Cancer of the urinary tract
- Bronchiolo-alveolar carcinoma
- Bone cancer
- Brain cancer

# Radiation

**Impact Estimate** 

Bone, Brain, Colon, Lung, and Ovarian Cancers

- Administrative costs: \$33,934,297 over ten years
- Benefit costs: \$768,601,698 over ten years
- New awards: 13,692 in the first year, and 62,683 disability claims and 32,650 DIC claims over the next five years

# Diseases Associated with Exposure to Certain Herbicides – 38 CFR 3.309(e)

- Chloracne or other acneform disease consistent with chloracne
- Type 2 diabetes
- Hodgkin's disease
- Chronic lymphocytic leukemia
- Multiple myeloma
- Non-Hodgkin's lymphoma
- Acute and subacute peripheral neuropathy
- Porphyria cutanea tarda
- Prostate cancer
- Respiratory cancers (lung, bronchus, larynx, or trachea)
- Soft-tissue sarcoma (other than osteosarcoma, chondrosarcoma, Kaposi's sarcoma, or mesothelioma)





# Presumption of Service Connection for Type 2 Diabetes Impact Estimates

- Administrative costs: \$6.4 million in 2001 and \$62 million through 2005
- <u>FTE</u>: 128 (2001), 378 (2002), 311 (2003), 185 (2004), and 123 (2005)
- Benefit costs: \$66.4 million during 2001 and \$3.3 billion through 2005
- New awards: 20,399 in the first year and 179,000 over the next five years
- Estimates did not include retroactive payments

- 1995 Presumptions for undiagnosed Gulf War illnesses
- 2001 No impact associated with extending the manifestation period to December 31, 2006
