- Q. What aircrew units were involved in the Ranch Hand operations?
 - A. November 1961 it was the 4500th Operations Squadron TDY from Langley
 AFB (crews rotated in and out, and consisted of crewmembers,
 maintenance personnel and aerial spray specialists)
 - June 1964 the 4500 Operations Squadron was replaced by the 309th Troop Carrier Squadron TDY from Clark AB, Philippines (crews rotated in and out and consisted of crewmembers, maintenance personnel and aerial spray specialists)
 - July 1964 the 309th Troop Carrier Squadron was replaced by a permanent unit created at Tan Son Nhut named Detachment 1, 315th Troop Carrier Group
 - March 1965 the name of Detachment 1, 315th Troop Carrier Group changed to Special Aerial Spray Flight
 - October 1966 the name of Special Aerial Spray Flight changed to the 309th Air Carrier Squadron, attached to the 315th Troop Carrier Group
 - October 1966 the name of the 309th Air Carrier Squadron changed to the 12th Air Commando Squadron
 - December 1966 the 12th Air Commando Squadron moved to Bien Hoa
 - April 1967 the name of the 12th Air Commando Squadron changed to the 12th Special Operations Squadron, it continued operating at Bien Hoa, with operating locations at Phu Cat and Da Nang. (although the squadron remained there until July 1970, in April 1970, they stopped spraying Herbicide Orange)
 - July 1970 the name of the 12th Special Operations Squadron changed to A Flight, 310th Tactical Airlift Squadron and moved to Phan Rang

January 1971 - the unit was dishanded
