USS Gallop (PG-85)	<u>USS Henrico (APA-45)</u> [amphibious attack transport] operated on Hue River during March 1965 and conducted numerous troop landing through March 1967
USS Antelope (PG-86)	<u>USS Montrose (APA-212)</u> operated on Song Hue River during December 1965, operated on Long Tau River during March 1967, and operated on Cua Viet River and at Dong Ha during May 1967
