# This-N-That

As many of you know Members of Congress are great for good lip service, but when it comes to Veterans, they're just not always there for you!

One bill has been coming up over and over for at least ten years now that I'm aware of and that is a bill which would deal with the SBP/DIC off set!

SBP is paid for by the Soldier/Veteran and is a life insurance policy which you pay for! DIC (Disability Indemnity Compensation) is also in essence a life insurance policy too, but this is paid for by your service and when the time comes paid for in full by your life!

For years and years now, widows have been penalized as it's called double dipping! Which it is NOT, one policy is paid for by your hard earned money the other is as I said paid for by the loss of your life. But the penalty is that what ever amount you receive from DIC benefits, is deducted from SBP benefits.

To me this is the worst form of GRAND THEFT and could be as much as \$1,075.00 per month that your widow is NOT or will NOT receive! And that is a hell of a lot of money to many and sometimes could mean the difference between paying the mortgage or rent along with utilities, and putting food on the table or making co-payments on doctors visits and medications!

And this truly does need to stop and widows be compensation for this theft of benefits due, so I really am asking for your help!

I need for every one who reads our newsletter to please burn up those phone lines, call your reps in DC and ask your Senators to co-sponsor and vote for S-979, then call your Congressman and ask they co-sponsor and vote for HR-1594!

Further down in this newsletter are phone numbers you can use to call them. Then log on to their websites and send them a message there, and you can also push a little more by going to the <a href="CapWiz">CapWiz</a> site, fill in your information, then click on the section where is shows the SBP/DIC bills and send that pre-written message!

I can't stress enough how important this is for the 60,000+ widows now, and all our future widows! So please, please, please, help us to get these bills voted on, passed, and signed into law!

Make you voice count!

# Giving Widows More Relief from SBP-DIC Offset

In a hopeful sign for 60,000 military widows and widowers who lost spouses to service-connected illnesses or injuries, a key House subcommittee is taking a fresh look at how Congress might allow a further easing the "SBP-DIC offset" to provide heartier and fairer survivor benefit packages. Rep. Joe Heck (R-Nev.), chairman of the House armed services subcommittee on military personnel, isn't promising yet specific relief from the offset, which surviving spouses prefer to call the "military widows' tax". But Heck and colleagues did gather anew complaints about the offset during a special December hearing, and vowed to look for ways to end it, or at least to continue to dull its effect on the widows' financial health.

#### TRICARE: State of Emergency in Tennessee

The governor of Tennessee has declared a State of Emergency due to tornadoes. Emergency prescription refill procedures are in place through January 11, 2016. To get an emergency refill, take your prescription bottle to any TRICARE retail network pharmacy. To find a network pharmacy, call Express Scripts at 1-877-363-1303 or search the <a href="network pharmacy locator">network pharmacy locator</a>. If possible, visit the pharmacy where the prescription was filled. If you use a retail chain, you can fill your prescription at another store in that chain. If your provider is available, he or she may call in a new prescription to any network pharmacy. You can request assistance at another pharmacy, but it is at that pharmacy's discretion to help you.

# Avoiding Errant Termination of VA Benefits

In response to letters and pressure by Congressman David Jolly, R-Indian Shores, Fla., the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) is instituting a new process to avoid wrongly declaring veterans deceased. In a recent letter sent to Jolly, the VA says it erroneously stopped benefits to 115 people between July 7, 2014 and April 1, 2015. Under the new guidelines, beneficiaries will have an opportunity to correct an error before the VA terminates their monthly benefits. #### Department of Defense Releases Third Quarter Calendar Year 2015 Suicide Information

Today, the Department of Defense released the Quarterly Suicide Report (QSR) for the third quarter of calendar year 2015.

The report summarizes confirmed suicide counts for all services and components during the months of July through September 2015, and also includes total suicide counts for calendar years 2012, 2013 and 2014.

In the third quarter of 2015, there were 72 suicides among service members in the active component, and 70 suicides in the reserve component, which includes 38 suicides among reserve service members and 32 suicides among service members in the National Guard.

The QSR is intended to communicate the department's suicide data on a routine basis. # **Veterans Treatment Court Pilot Program**

A Veterans Treatment Court, the first of its kind located on a major military installation, was recently established at Fort Hood. The Veterans Treatment Court on Fort Hood (VETS Court) will work to divert veterans with service-connected mental health or substance abuse disorders out of the court system and into enduring treatment solutions. The VETS Court will offer community supervision and treatment provided by the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) as an alternative to federal convictions for qualified veterans charged with committing misdemeanors while on Fort Hood. Individuals seeking to get involved in supporting veterans in the VETS Court are encouraged to contact Magistrate Court on Fort Hood or the Texas Veterans Commission Military Veteran Peer Network.

## Navy Wants Smartphone App to Diagnose PTSD, TBI

Officials with the Office of Naval Research are supporting the development of a smartphone application that may help to screen for autism in children — and, down the road, may identify symptoms of post-traumatic stress disorder and traumatic brain injury in war veterans. The technology in play is an algorithm that maps landmarks on faces and assesses emotional responses based on facial movements, officials said in a news release. 
The documents library has many different categories and contains more than 55 million pages of information and forms.

# State of Emergency in Several States due to Storm Goliath

The governors of Missouri, Alabama, New Mexico, and Texas have declared a State of Emergency for all four states (the entire states) due to Storm Goliath. In these states, emergency prescription refill procedures are in place from December 28, 2015 through January 27, 2016.

The governors of Georgia, Louisiana, Illinois, and Mississippi have also declared States of Emergency for all four states (the entire states) due to Storm Goliath. In these states, emergency prescription refill procedures are in place from December 30, 2015 through January 29, 2016.

#### Emergency Refills

To get an emergency refill, take your prescription bottle to any TRICARE retail network pharmacy. To find a network pharmacy:

#### My TRICARE: Amend it But Don't End it!

The House and Senate Armed Services Committees want to replace the current TRICARE program with an entriely new system, and plan to craft legislation this year to achieve this objective. The starting point will be the health care recommendations from the Military Compensation and Retirement Modernization Commission (MCRMC) that suggests that TRICARE be replaced with a plan similar to the Federal Employee Health Benefit Program (FEHBP). The MCRMC proposal recommends that "Non-Medicare eligible retirees should continue to have full access to the military health benefit program at cost contributions that gradually increase over many years..." These beneficiaries would eventually be required to pay 20 percent of all health care costs, and premiums would be increased every year to ensure that beneficiaries keep paying 20 percent. Like FEHBP beneficiaries, this new program would allow beneficiaries to choose from a selection of commercial insurance plans.

FRA believes that a military retiree's health care premium, is at least in part, paid for with 20 or more years of arduous military service. FRA advocates that military beneficiaries incur distinctive and extraordinary physical and mental stresses that are completely different to the service conditions of federal civilian employees, and their health benefits should be significantly better than civilian programs. Further the Association does not believe that TRICARE cannot be fixed. Please use the Action Center to ask your legislators to amend TRICARE but don't end it!

#### C-141C Hanoi Taxi Exhibit at AF Museum

Restoration crews at the National Museum of the U.S. Air Force recently moved the Lockheed C-141C Hanoi Taxi into the museum's new fourth building. The aircraft, which airlifted the first American prisoners of war out of North Vietnam in February 1973, will be displayed in the Global Reach Gallery. The public will be able to view the aircraft as they move into the fourth building from a designated area on the museum grounds. The 224,000 square foot fourth building is scheduled to open to the public in June 2016. # Ft. Lewis Army Museum Seeks Volunteers
