Although the VA is not always easy to deal with, and getting them to approve or even provide a service dog to help with PTSD, I still always strongly recommend to every Veteran I work with to seriously consider a rescue dog.

I've seen and many others have told me they too have seen that even a rescue dog is tremendously helpful, and seriously they don't need special training to help Veterans through difficult times. They have a "sixth" sense built in and just know when you need them most and will just be there for you.

Owning a dog can lift your mood or help you feel less stressed. Dogs can help people feel better by providing companionship. All dog owners, including those who have PTSD can experience these benefits.

What are the emotional benefits of having a dog?

- Dogs can make great pets. Having a dog as a pet can benefit anyone who likes dogs, including people with PTSD. For example, dogs:
- Help bring out feelings of love.
- Are good companions.
- Take orders well when trained. This can be very comfortable for a Servicemember or Veteran who was used to giving orders in the military.
- Are fun and can help reduce stress.
- Are a good reason to get out of the house, spend time outdoors, and meet new people.

An emotional support animal is a pet that helps an owner with a mental health condition. Emotional support dogs help owners feel better by giving friendship and companionship. These dogs are also called comfort dogs or support dogs.

And when you adopt a rescue dog, consider this:

You're saving two lives! That of the dog you rescue, and your own!

VA to Look for Electronic Health Record Help in Private Sector

The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) is considering companies in the private sector to manage the massive database of veterans' health records.

The VA asked for "industry feedback, guidance and recommendations" regarding its electronic health record (EHR) system in an official request for information, according to the government contracting website FedBizOps.com.

The VA's current EHR system has become complex and each region works differently. If the records aren't easily transferred between hospitals, it undermines a key advantage of electronic records.

While an update to the system is needed, the fact that each region has added its own elements to the software over the years makes "modernization and standardization efforts extremely complicated, expensive and time consuming," the request says.

TREA: The Enlisted Association has been pushing for an upgrade, or a replacement, of the existing 1970s-era Vist-A system for seemingly decades now. Hopefully VA finds the information that they need from the new Request for Information (RFI) and VA's EHR system can be brought into the 21st century. We will keep you updated when there is more information.

The goals of the DoD Vietnam War Commemorative Program are:

- 1. To thank and honor veterans of the Vietnam War, including personnel who were held as prisoners of war (POW), or listed as missing in action (MIA), for their service and sacrifice on behalf of the United States and to thank and honor the families of these veterans.
- 2. To highlight the service of the Armed Forces during the Vietnam War and the contributions of Federal agencies and governmental and non-governmental organizations that served with, or in support of, the Armed Forces.
- 3. To pay tribute to the contributions made on the home front by the people of the United States during the Vietnam War.
- 4. To highlight the advances in technology, science, and medicine related to military research conducted during the Vietnam War.
- 5. To recognize the contributions and sacrifices made by the allies of the United States during the Vietnam War.

IRS Provides 'Information for Veterans'

The Internal Revenue Service's (IRS) Stakeholder Partnerships, Education and Communication (SPEC) office has a special webpage called 'Information for Veterans'. The page highlights programs offering tax preparation and counseling services, in addition to information about VA disability benefits, homeless veterans, veteran legal services, programs for hiring veterans and much more. The webpage will be updated frequently to include the latest news and information about VA/IRS partnership and any new tax information for veterans as well as Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) programs. SPEC is the education and outreach department of the IRS. SPEC is widely known for oversight of the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) and Tax Counseling for the Elderly (TCE) programs, which offer free tax return preparation to these taxpayers.

Commissaries to Enhance Their Method of Calculating Savings

The Defense Commissary Agency is forming a new approach to calculating savings, aligning it more closely with private sector practice. This better reflects what patrons experience daily with the products they routinely buy in the geographic regions in which they routinely shop, agency officials said.

"We hear from our military families that they sometimes find lower prices on selected items outside the gate," said Joseph H. Jeu, DeCA's director and CEO. "For the first time through this new approach, we will compare our prices with local grocers on a more frequent basis to better inform our customers of potential cost savings over stores in their nearby community."

"Our approach to calculating savings will not impact the prices our customers pay or the dollar benefit that they receive," he added. "There will be no change to their out-of-pocket expense."

Through this improved process, DeCA will calculate and monitor patron savings more frequently than the current practice. Prices will be compared with actual prices at local competitors surrounding each commissary, as well, using a market basket of products that reflect what patrons normally purchase.



Most total force members have questions about the new Blended Retirement System (BRS) including how it will work and who is eligible. The new BRS leader course is designed to educate leaders on the new retirement system. The course is available both online and through a mobile version for a smartphone or tablet via **Joint Knowledge Online**, course number P-US1330. The course is also available to those without a Common Access Card, to include family members, via an alternate **website**. The mobile version has a login option that provides a training certificate, which will be necessary for the required opt-in training next year. Leaders can download the app from their respective app store for free.



18 Servicemembers on Olympic Team

Among the 555 members of Team USA at the 2016 Summer Olympics in Rio de Janerio, Brazil, are 18 U.S. service members. The athletes represent the Army, Navy and Air Force competing in events ranging from rowing, to track and field, to shooting. For more details, see this Under the Radar post.

During last May's Naval Academy graduation ceremony Secretary of Defense Ashton Carter announced that both Navy fullback Chris Swain and Wide receiver Keenan Reynolds were being granted their requests to defer their military obligations until their time playing with the NFL was over. During the first exhibition games last week both Reynolds with the Baltimore Ravens and Swain with the San Diego Chargers started their professional football careers.

Last year, Swain ran for 1,023 yards and 10 touchdowns on 211 carries as part of the No. 2-ranked rushing offense in major college football. Reynolds had 1,373 yards and 24 touchdowns to cap a record-setting career in Annapolis. Navy finished 11-2, including a 14th straight win against Army to extend the series record. The Midshipmen also won a third consecutive bowl game for the first time in program history.

VA Releases Vet Suicide Report

The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) has released its findings from the nation's most comprehensive analysis of veteran suicide rates in the United States. VA examined more than 55 million Veterans' records from 1979 to 2014 from every state in the nation. The effort advances VA's knowledge from the previous report in 2012. The current analysis indicates that in 2014 an average of 20 Veterans a day died from suicide. A summary of the report's findings is available on the VA website. The report is available online. VA Predicts Emergency Care Claim Tsunami

More than two million claims for private sector emergency healthcare services provided to VA-enrolled veterans since February 2010 could be eligible for VA reimbursement if a recent ruling by the U.S. Court of Appeals for Veterans Claims is allowed to stand, the VA general counsel has warned. The counsel also has warned in court documents that over the next decade VA could be swamped with an estimated 68.6 million additional claims for emergency care reimbursements, which could drive up VA health costs over that period by as much as \$10.6 billion.

TRICARE Webinar to Discuss Health Care Options

TRICARE and Military OneSource are co-hosting a webinar to discuss health care options available to TRICARE beneficiaries once they are no longer eligible for any TRICARE health plan coverage. The webinar will be held on Wednesday, August 17, 2016 at noon EST. Go to this site to register. Registration is on a first-come, first-served basis and is limited due to system capacity. Work Opportunity Tax Credit

The Work Opportunity Tax Credit (WOTC) offers a tax benefit for businesses that hire individuals, such as veterans, who are having trouble finding work. This temporary tax break is in effect through 2019, unless renewed by Congress. Employers can earn a tax credit up to \$9,600 for certain military veteran employees. The exact tax benefit amount that a business can receive depends on several factors such as how long the new employee was unemployed, the new employee's salary, and the number of hours the new employee worked during the first year.
