Arlington National Cemetery Plans to Expand

The Army Times is reporting in the June 15, 2017 issue that Arlington National Cemetery will move forward with plans to expand the cemetery by more than 50,000 spaces that will extend the life of the cemetery from 2041 to until 2050. These additional burial sites will provide expansion from lands from the original Navy Annex complex and other adjacent areas at the cemetery. A December 2016 survey of FRA members reveals that 92 percent support immediate expansion of the Cemetery and 67 percent want to reserve a set amount of space for Medal of Honor recipients and/or active duty deaths.

VA Secretary Formalizes Expansion of Emergency Mental Health Care to Former Service Members With Other-Than-Honorable Discharges Secretary Announced Plans to Expand Coverage in March

WASHINGTON — Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) today released finalized plans that lay the framework for providing emergency mental health coverage to former service members with other-than-honorable (OTH) administrative discharges.

This is the first time a VA Secretary has implemented an initiative specifically focused on this group of former service members who are in mental health distress.

"Suicide prevention is my top clinical priority," said Secretary Shulkin, also a physician. "We want these former service members to know there is someplace they can turn if they are facing a mental health emergency whether it means urgent care at a VA emergency department, a Vet Center or through the Veterans Crisis Line."

Effective July 5, all Veterans Health Administration (VHA) medical centers will be prepared to offer emergency stabilization care for former service members who present at the facility with an emergent mental health need. Under this initiative, former service members with an OTH administrative discharge may receive care for their mental health emergency for an initial period of up to 90 days, which can include inpatient, residential or outpatient care.

During this time, VHA and the Veterans Benefits Administration will work together to determine if the mental health condition is a result of a servicerelated injury, making the service member eligible for ongoing coverage for that condition.

Since Secretary Shulkin announced his intent in March to expand VA mental health coverage to service members with OTH administrative discharges, VA has worked with key internal and external stakeholders, including members of Congress, Veterans Service Organizations and community partners on the issue.

VA to Expand Caregiver Stipends, But not

Soon

VA Secretary David Shulkin told Congress that he supports a change in law to expand the Post-9/11 caregiver program so that its cash stipend and menu of support services can benefit caregivers to severely injured veterans from earlier generations. But, the VA wants to standardize how the Post-9/11 program is administered across more than 150 VA medical facilities supported by more than 360 caregiver coordinators before doing so.

New DoD Sexual Assault Recovery Program

The Department of Defense (DoD) has launched an online and mobile educational program to help individuals begin to recover after a sexual assault. The self-guided program, called 'Building Hope and Resiliency: Addressing the Effects of Sexual Assault,' can be completed at the user's pace. Blue Angels Bring Back Fat Albert

The U.S. Navy Flight Demonstration Squadron C-130 Hercules, affectionately known as Fat Albert, recently returned to its role as the logistics and transport aircraft of the Blue Angels. Fat Albert underwent a ten-month preplanned Periodic Maintenance Interval (PMI), which allowed for her to go through extensive maintenance checks and repairs that are required every five years. While the aircraft will resume its role transporting the Blue Angels maintenance and support team, it will still be several more weeks before it performs at air shows. The C-130 has been the support aircraft of the Blue Angels since 1970, but began performing short demonstrations prior to the jet demonstrations in 1975. A Look at the History of the GI Bill

The National WWII Museum in New Orleans is hosting an exhibit on the Servicemen's Readjustment Act of 1944 (The GI Bill). On display are the original cover and signature pages of the Servicemen's Readjustment Act of 1944, on loan from the National Archives, and the typed speech, with handwritten editing marks, given by President Franklin D. Roosevelt on June 22, 1944, after he signed the act into law. The exhibit also features illustrated panels and touchscreen videos that tell the story of the GI Bill, from the situation in 1943 when tens of thousands of disabled GIs were returning to their home communities in need of support. VA Plans to Close Underutilized Facilities

The Department of Veterans Affairs has announced a plan to dispose of all vacant VA buildings in 24 months (either by demolishing or setting for reuse). Nationwide, VA currently has 430 vacant or mostly vacant buildings that are on average more than 60 years old, and cost taxpayers more than \$7 million per year to maintain. Of those 430 buildings, VA has begun disposal or reuse processes on 71. Also, the Veterans Benefits Administration is freezing its footprint and will maximize space management by leasing or eliminating office space nationwide. VA estimates these actions will save taxpayers an additional \$15.7 million annually beginning in 2017, for a total of close to \$23 million in combined annual savings from the initiatives.

POW/MIA Agency Deploys Team

The Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency (DPAA) deployed an Underwater Recovery Team (URT) comprised of Department of Defense civilians and U.S. Army, Navy and Air Force servicemembers to northern Vietnam in search of two U.S. Navy aviators who went missing during the Vietnam War. The two men were on a nighttime reconnaissance mission over northeastern Nghe An and southeastern Thanh Hoa provinces when their F-4B Phantom aircraft vanished from radar, Sept. 21, 1966. To this day, the two men remain unaccounted-for. The URT spent about six weeks in Vietnam searching for signs of the lost aviators. For more information, visit the DPAA website.


