

Your expertise in Agent Orange contamination was of great value to the UC-123K System Program Office and the United States Air Force. Thanks to your support, the remaining fleet of UC-123K aircraft used to distribute Agent Orange during the Vietnam War from 1962 to 1971 were destroyed and smelted.
