
Complete the VFW's 2021 COVID-19 Health Survey



Awareness Connecting Veterans with Free Telephone Captioning Services

Did you know Veterans and others with hearing loss can receive FREE assistive technology for captioned telephone service from participating providers of the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) on their home phones, mobile phones and other communication apps?

These services provide real-time transcriptions of communication which are a vital need for those who rely on their phones to stay connected with family and friends, and to communicate with health care professionals and emergency responders.

According to the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA), veterans are 30% more likely than non-Veterans to have a hearing impairment, which is the fastest growing post-war disability. Currently, nearly 3 million veterans with hearing loss and tinnitus receive benefits from VA, with over 600,000 veterans of the Iraq and Afghanistan wars alone returning home with permanent hearing loss.

Clear2Connect Coalition, has been raising awareness and educating The White House, Congress, the VA, and the DoD about the critical importance of quality, accurate Captioned Telephone Services (CTS).

What is Captioned Telephone Service?

Captioned telephone service enables people with hearing loss to speak during a phone call and then read the other person's response in real time as transcriptions appear directly on their telephone or an app. This service is known as Internet Protocol Captioned Telephone Service (IP CTS), and it uses a combination of automatic speech recognition (ASR) technology and skilled transcribers, or ASR technology.

The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requires that captioned telephone service be "functionally equivalent" to communication technology used by individuals without hearing loss. This service is overseen by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC).

Who is Eligible for Captioned Telephone Service and What does it Cost?

This technology service is free to service members and Veterans, including their loved ones and anyone with hearing loss.

Vietnam Veteran and captioned telephone user Ronald Drach says this service is "invaluable" and "life-changing."

Vietnam Veteran Robert Richardson agrees, saying, "This technology, above all others, has had a major impact on my quality of life. I'd say it's a lifesaver. I use it to communicate with my children, and I use it to communicate with my friends and my doctors and other healthcare providers. I use it to stay engaged in my community. I may be retired from work, but not from life."

How to Get Free Captioned Telephone Service

Several providers offer captioned telephone service. When registering for this service with providers, the FCC requires individuals to self-certify that they have hearing loss necessitating telephone captioning. Some providers may require professional certification from a physician, audiologist or other hearing-health professional.

The Clear2Connect Coalition, which is comprised of Disability and Veterans Service Organizations, advocates on behalf of the deaf and hard of hearing communities to have access to quality, accurate communication technology.



COVID-19 Funeral Expense Reimbursement

Due to the American Rescue Plan Act and other COVID-19-related legislation recently passed into law, FEMA will be able to provide financial assistance for COVID-19-related funeral expenses acquired after Jan. 20, 2020. Although applications are not yet being accepted FEMA anticipates beginning later this month and is working on establishing a toll-free phone number for applying for assistance. People who have incurred COVID-19-related funeral expenses are being advised to keep and gather documents, like an official death certificate that shows the death is COVID-19 related and funeral expense documents. FEMA will also need proof of funds received from other sources such as VA, to determine the amount of your benefit. BEWARE of scammers – FEMA will not contact people prior to them registering for assistance. Learn more.

FRA Assistant Director Veterans Programs Noelle Huffer participated in the Independent Review Commission (IRC) on Military Sexual Assault video conference call. The 90-day investigation began on March 24th. The IRC will focus on four priority areas

including accountability; prevention; climate and culture; and victim care and support. The commission is comprised of a total of 12 members with three members in each of the four priority areas. The commission will focus on evaluating military policies, programs, and processes related to sexual assault. It will also review and assess the best practices from industry, academia, and other organizations.

Commissioners focusing on accountability will assess the role of the Uniform Code of Military Justice in addressing the prevalence of sexual assault and harassment, survivor likelihood of reporting, and the ability to appropriately bring alleged perpetrators to justice. The prevention working group will assess the services' ongoing prevention efforts so they may identify potential gaps there. They also will attempt to identify where additional resources might be needed. To address climate and culture regarding sexual assault, that working group will review the implementation of existing support policies and resources across the department. They will also propose new approaches to improve climate and culture that can better ensure all service members feel comfortable reporting sexual assault and using existing services. Finally, the victim care and support working group will review both clinical and non-clinical victim services currently in place to ensure comprehensiveness and availability to all victims regardless of how those victims report.

Individuals such as victims and survivors, their family members, or friends who have personal stories relevant to the IRC's work are encouraged to provide feedback to the IRC using the Military Feedback Form on the DoD Safe Helpline website.







The USS Oklahoma sustained multiple torpedo hits, which caused it to quickly capsize. The attack on the ship resulted in the deaths of 429 crewmen, including Magers.
